Inaugural National AUSA Golf Invitational a "Joint" Success

The idea for a golf tournament prior to the National AUSA meeting, which has been discussed for a few years, finally came to pass on Saturday, October 23 as the Fairfax-Lee and George Washington chapters hosted the first-ever national AUSA Golf Invitational at Westfield's Golf Club.

From the very beginning, the chapters worked as a "joint team" to make this a memorable and quality event and the results bore this out. The effort was spearheaded by the tournament director, Ms. Renee Lyles from HP who coordinated sponsors, participants, prizes, gifts, and other tournament details that go on behind the scenes. And Renee even managed to persuade the weatherman to order up a beautiful autumn day.

Gifts included golf shirts, ball repair kits and ball markers with the AUSA 60th Year logo, Fairfax-Lee chapter logo, and George Washington

chapter logo; golf balls; and a tournament bag.

contributions to the event and fifteen members were on-site at the officers' club setting up tables, organizing gifts, taking photographs, registering attendees, and supporting the event in a variety of ways.

COL Susan Annicelli, Commander of Dewitt Army Hospital and CPT Shaunta Hollingsworth, WTU Commander, welcomed guests to the party. The cute seven-year-old daughter of one of the wounded warriors lead the Pledge of Allegiance and the Dewitt Army Hospital and WTU chaplain, Maj. Bowden, gave thanks prior to the meal.

In 2007, the Army created 35 warrior transition units (WTUs) at Army installations to fill a gap in support personnel for wounded Soldiers. The WTUs provide critical support to wounded Soldiers, who are expected to require six months of rehabilitative care and the need for complex medical management, and their families. The units have physicians, nurses, squad leaders, platoon sergeants, and mental health professionals. These leaders are responsible for making sure wounded Soldiers' needs are met, their care is coordinated, and their families are taken care of.

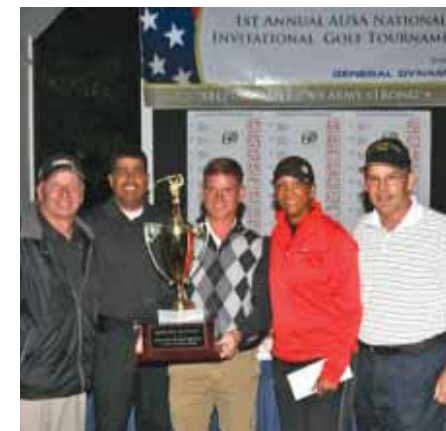

Fairfax-Lee Corporate Appreciation Luncheon

The Chapter's Corporate Appreciation Luncheon was held 3 Dec 2010 at the Hilton Springfield. Vice Adm. Al Thompson, Director of the Fort Belvoir-based Defense Logistics Agency was the guest speaker and provided an insightful briefing on the operations of the DLA world-wide. Admiral Thompson was accompanied by Command Sgt. Maj. Otis N. Cuffee, Senior Enlisted Leader of Defense Logistics Agency. The DLA is the Department of Defense's largest logistics combat support agency, providing worldwide logistics support in both peacetime and wartime to the military services as well

as several civilian agencies and foreign countries and employs about 26,000 people.

Adm. Thompson's briefing explained how the Agency sources and provides nearly 100 percent of the consumable items America's military forces need to operate . . . from food, fuel and energy, to uniforms, medical supplies, and construction and barrier equipment. DLA also supplies about 84 percent of the military's spare parts. In addition, the Agency manages the reutilization of military equipment, provides catalogs and other logistics information products, and offers document automation and production services.

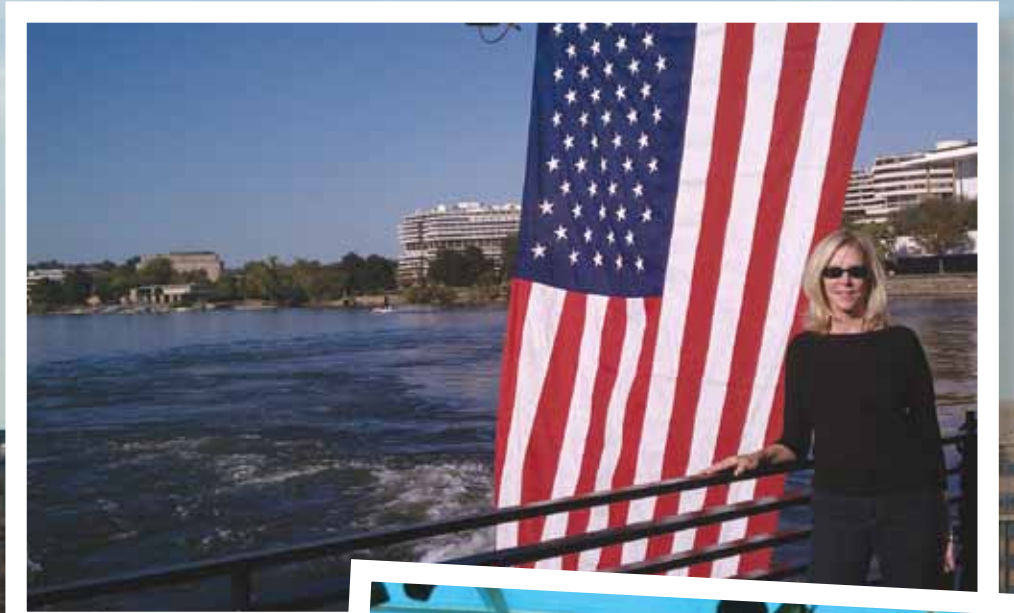
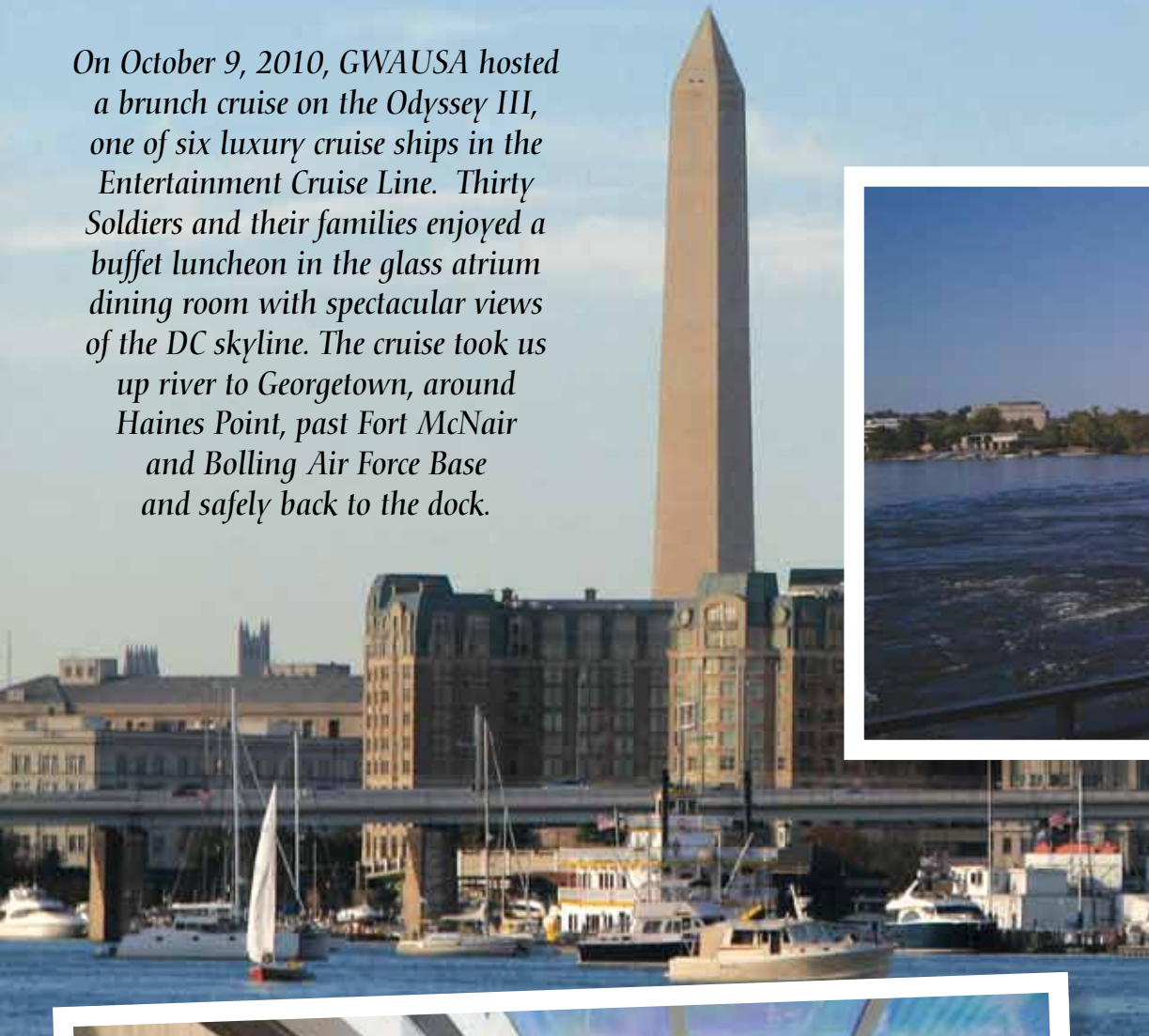
at Ft. Belvoir next September as a result of the BRAC action.

Each year, tens of thousands of runners and spectators come to Washington, D.C. to join in Army's annual 10-mile race to promote the Army, build esprit de corps, support fitness goals, and enhance community relations. The U.S. Army Ten-Miler proceeds support Army morale, welfare and recreation, a comprehensive network of support and leisure services designed to enhance the lives of Soldiers and their families.
